## **Kawandi Quilts**

Kawandis are improvisational, hand-quilted scrappy quilts originating with the Siddi people of India. Several of us in the Quaking Aspen Quilt Guild's Kawandi Small Group learned to make Kawandis from quilter Sujata Shah, who writes:

"A Kawandi is a utility quilt made by African Diaspora/Siddi community of India. A spool of thread and a needle, few scraps, and mindful stitching combined with a simple technique are the only elements needed for this age-old art of quilting."
